

CHRISTINE BLACK - Article

BADMINTON Scotland is delighted that Christine Black is the appointed Manager for the Scottish Commonwealth Games Team at Glasgow 2014, the third time she has been Badminton Team Manager for Scotland at a Commonwealth Games. This is a high profile role which will serve to inspire women in Scotland and demonstrate what can be achieved.

In her full-time role, Christine is a Badminton Development Officer in the Lothian area of Scotland, and as such has been a driving force in the coaching and development of the careers of many Scottish players, including players such as Scottish international juniors Megan Richardson and Hannah Laing. Christine's development work and coaching of high performance players in the East of Scotland has had a profoundly positive

effect on Scottish National teams, with many female players being produced.

Furthermore, the sheer level of Christine's involvement and her achievements in the sport of badminton are extraordinary and act as an inspiration to females involved in badminton in Scotland.

Additionally, this season Christine became World Champion in mixed doubles at 55+ age group, as well as winning silver in women's singles and doubles. She was also a key member of the Scotland team which very nearly beat England for the first time in the history of the annual Robert McCoig International veterans match.

Christine's achievements in high performance badminton in coaching, developing and managing high performance players, as well as her own achievements in high performance badminton, have been the driving force in the development of many female Scottish players and act as an inspiration to many more.

Christine's broad involvement in Scottish badminton continues to be an inspiration to women in badminton, and indeed in other sports as well. Additionally, Christine is involved in badminton in many other ways. She is a Director of Badminton Scotland and Chairperson of Mid & East Lothian Schools. Christine is also heavily involved in Para Badminton - she is a member of the Scottish Disability Badminton Working Group, the 4 Nations Para Badminton Working Group, and is also a selector for elite Scottish Para Badminton Teams. The breadth of Christine's involvement in badminton and the achievements she has accomplished will doubtless continue to inspire, showing what can be achieved by women in badminton and the positions they can attain.

Christine is a Past President of Badminton Scotland and was only the third female in Badminton Scotland's history to be President. She has encouraged other women to become directors of Scottish Badminton, as well as to become involved in coaching, developing and administering the sport.

Since the 1970s, Christine has been heavily involved in badminton across a variety of roles including coaching, developing, managing and administering the sport, as well as being an elite performance player herself, representing Scotland 56 times and winning bronze medals at European Championships and Commonwealth Games events, as well as

numerous World and European Veterans Championships medals.

The sheer level of Christine's involvement and her achievements in the sport of badminton are extraordinary. Her achievements in high performance badminton in coaching, developing and managing high performance players, as well as her own achievements in high performance badminton, and her ongoing commitments to managing and administering the sport at both a local and national level, make her an inspiration to women in badminton throughout Scotland.

With the launch of the Coach Education Course Level 3, it was discussed how to encourage more females to enrol for the course.


Pan Am reported they are working well on their Strategic Plan with Oceania successfully completing their Facebook page with very positive success to date.
